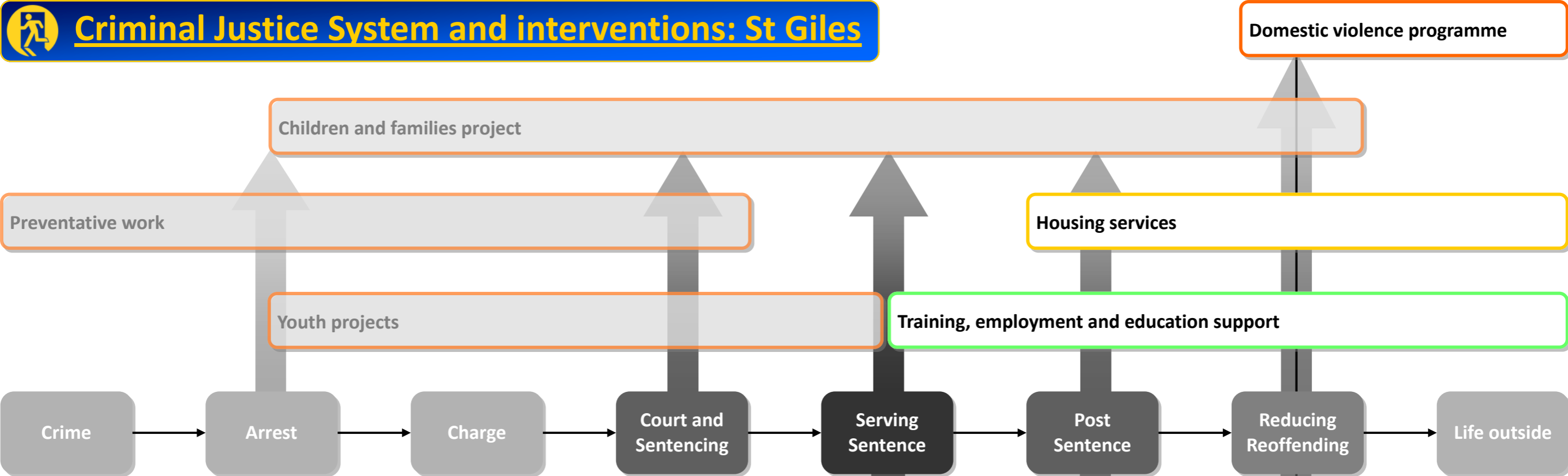


Criminal Justice System and interventions: St Giles

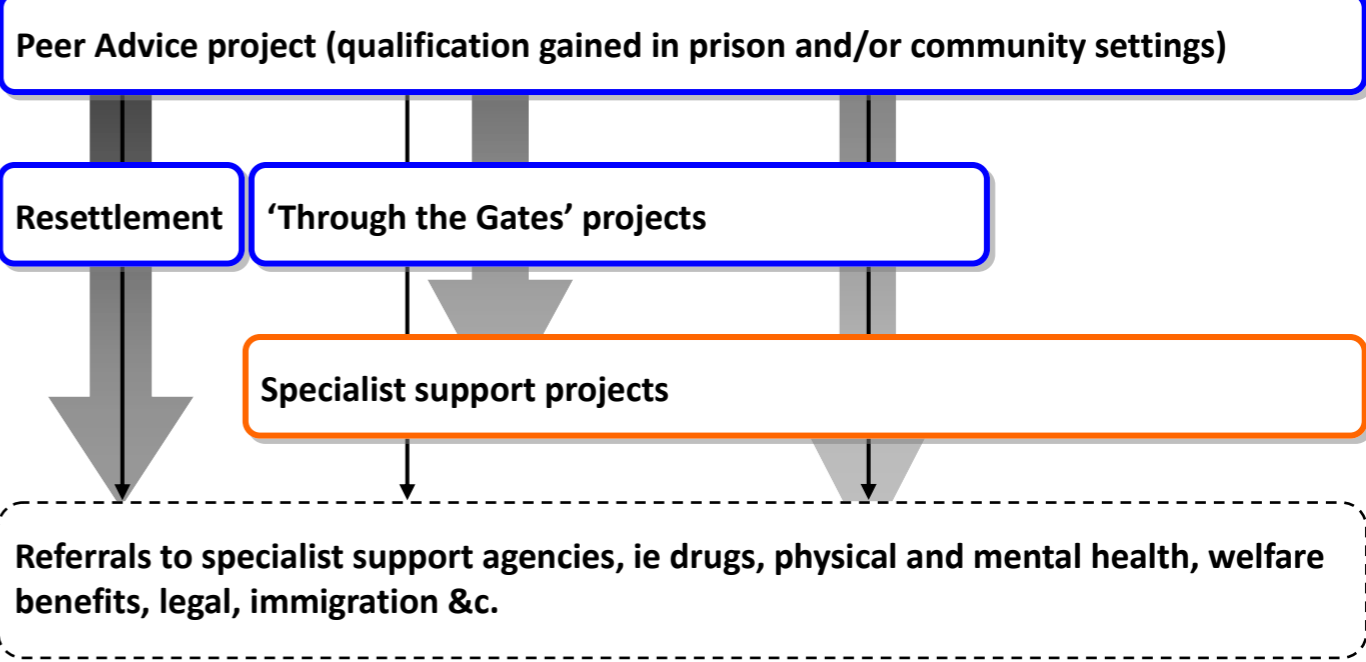


St Giles Trust was founded in 1962 as a daycentre for homeless people but for over 10 years has worked increasingly with offenders and ex-offenders in various settings.

In particular, St Giles Trust offers its unique and credible 'Peer Advice project', whose trainees (in prison or community settings) gain a nationally recognised qualification and become advice workers themselves, using their skills and experiences to help others in similar situations.



We also offer various 'Through the Gates' services - working with individuals in prison, and intensively from the day of release to resolve issues around housing, benefits, training and work.



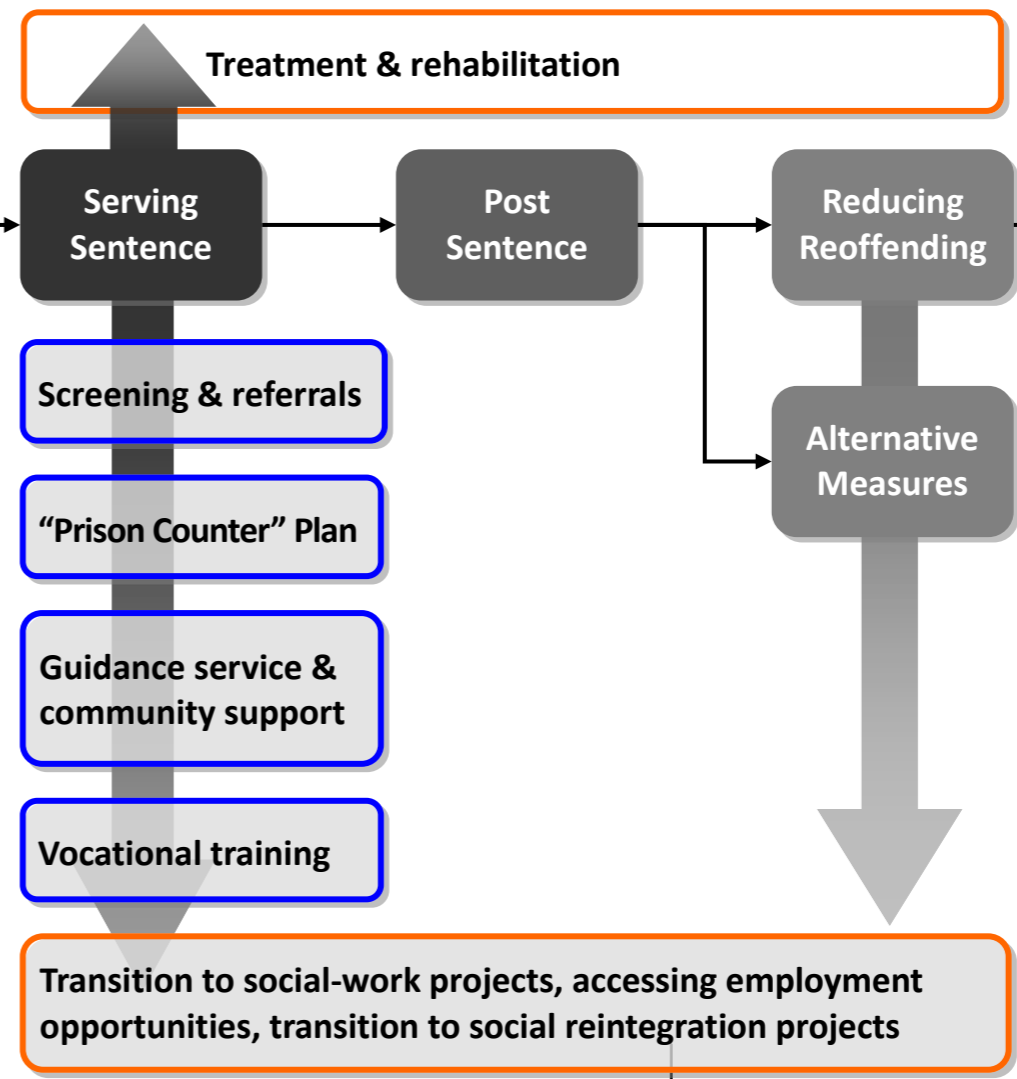
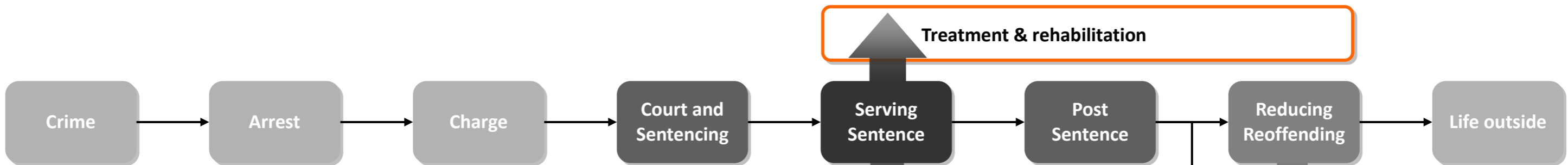

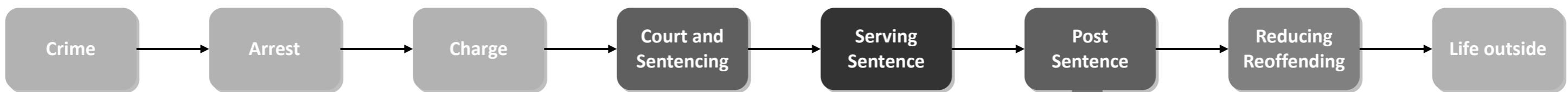
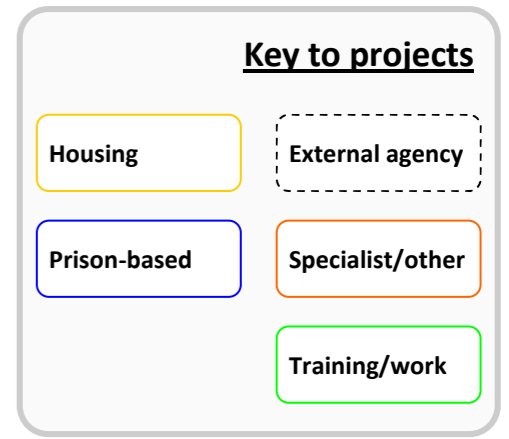


It operates both inside and outside of the Piedmont criminal justice system, in a methodological and in an innovative way.

Criminal Justice System and interventions: Epanodos

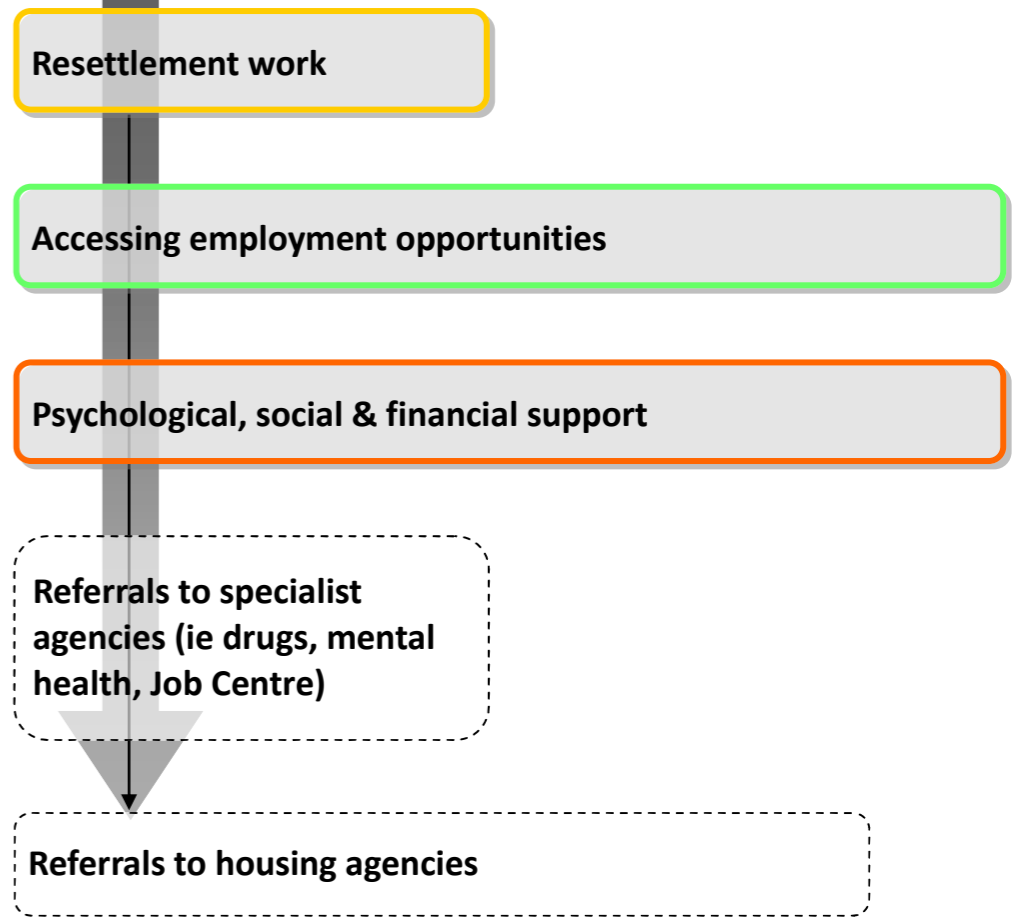


Epanodos is a non-profit organisation founded in 2003 under the aegis of the Greek Ministry of Justice to assist ex-offenders reintegrate into society by providing help for their social and professional resettlement.

Epanodos' primary objective is the resettlement of ex-offenders back in to society through enhancing and promoting their working skills and abilities.



They also offer financial, psychological and social support to ensure the successful resettlement of offenders.
